Introduction

The 'Publications' Guided Search displays a list of journal publications and reports that are linked to supporting data in CEBS (<https://cebs.niehs.nih.gov/cebs/>). Instructions for using this application along with additional information and examples are presented here.

1) Listing Publications

- From the CEBS Homepage, click "Publications" under 'DTT Guided Searches' to display an alphabetical list of all publications (journal articles and reports) with data in CEBS
- The publications are sorted by title, and each one includes the title, authors, publication year, DOI, and, when applicable, journal name, and PMID
- All text within the list is searchable, e.g., title, author, year, using the [Search] box located at the top-right of the list
- Each title is linked to its corresponding CEBS page (click any title to open the page).

Note: *Journal article DOIs link to the publication itself while non-journal publication DOIs link to the CEBS publication page, e.g., reports.*

2) Publication Types

a) Journal Article

- 1) The journal article publication page includes a brief reference to the journal and the DOI link to the publication (a PMID may also be given)
- 2) An 'On This Page' section has links to other sections of the page to easily navigate to a section of interest
- 3) The abstract and other specified sections appear below the header "Publication"

- and provide links to data e.g., Figures, Tables, Supplemental data, for the publication
- 4) Each section is identified by a relevant header and typically include the following:
 - **Figures** – A list of the figures in the publication with figure legends and links to download the figures
 - **Tables** – A list of the tables in the publication with table legends and links to download the tables, and/or supporting data for the table
 - **Supplemental Materials** – Any supplemental data, figures, tables, and/or resources for the publication with links to download the files
 - **Open Source Software** – Any open source software mentioned in the publication or software required to process data files included with the publication

Note: A publication may include only some or none of the information above and/or other categories, e.g., Images, depending on the data available and authors' choice.

b) Reports and Pre-publications

- 1) As with journal publications, the title, authors/contributors, DOI, and abstract are displayed, but an 'On This Page' section isn't
- 2) A "Study Data" section appears below the Abstract that has sub-sections based on the type of data provided, e.g., Body Weights, Individual Animal Data
- 3) File names for study data tables are listed in each sub-section

3) Downloading Data

- Review the list of file names displayed in the section/sub-section of interest, e.g., Tables
- Each name displayed is linked to that corresponding file containing the data
- Click the file names to be downloaded

4) Example

Type "Sholl" in the search box above the Publications list to locate the publication "Application of Sholl Analysis to Quantify Changes in Growth and Development in Rat Mammary Gland Whole Mounts"

- 1) Click the publication name shown in the search results to open the CEBS data page
- 2) Note that the "On This Page" section indicates data for Figures and Tables are available along with Supplemental Materials and Open Source Software

- 3) Click the PMID number link shown below the authors to open the PubMed abstract page or the DOI link to open the full journal article
- 4) From the 'On This Page' section, select 'Tables' to navigate to the Tables section
- 5) Under the header "Table 1. Mammary epithelial parameters" two text links are displayed, "Table 1" and "Table 1 supporting data: SAS output mammary epithelial statistics"
- 6) Click the links to download the corresponding data file

5) Additional Information
